# **Community Peace Officer**

**Department:** Administration / Governance

#### **Position Summary**

The Wuikinuxv Nation is seeking a trustworthy, culturally respectful, and community-centered individual to serve as a Community Peace Officer. This role is essential to supporting safety, harmony, and well-being in Wuikinuxv Village by ensuring that community laws are followed in a way that promotes education, understanding, and restorative justice.

The Peace Officer will work in partnership with Wuikinuxv leadership, administration, and departments to resolve disputes, enforce local bylaws, and provide a visible, neutral, and approachable presence in the community. This role requires the individual to remain impartial, non-biased, and act with fairness and neutrality always while upholding the Nation's values and laws.

### **Key Responsibilities**

- Promote and enforce Wuikinuxv Nation bylaws and community safety standards with respect, neutrality, and fairness.
- Respond to community concerns or bylaw violations using peacekeeping, non-biased mediation, and de-escalation techniques.
- Monitor public safety and animal-related matters, including stray or aggressive animals, and coordinate humane responses.
- Provide education and outreach to inform community members about their rights and responsibilities under Wuikinuxv law.
- Support a restorative and culturally informed approach to bylaw enforcement and conflict resolution.
- Act independently of internal or external pressures, and treat all community members equitably, without favoritism or prejudice.
- Work collaboratively with Nation departments such as Health, Housing, Public Works, and Education.

- Keep detailed records of incidents, community interactions, and actions taken in a professional, confidential, and neutral manner.
- Support wellness events, such as veterinary visits and community safety initiatives, in coordination with Animal Management Services.
- Help maintain the Animal Management Building as a safe, functional space for both administrative and animal care purposes.

#### Qualifications

- A strong commitment to community well-being, fairness, impartiality, and confidentiality.
- Knowledge of or willingness to learn Wuikinuxv values, protocols, and culturally safe practices.
- Experience in bylaw enforcement, peacekeeping, security, or conflict resolution is an asset.
- Skilled in listening, communication, and neutral problem-solving, especially in sensitive or high-stress situations.
- Ability to work independently and respond calmly under pressure.
- Must be dependable, organized, and respectful of all community members regardless of circumstances.
- Willingness to participate in training and certification, including community safety, restorative justice, or enforcement training.
- Class 5 Driver's License and access to a reliable vehicle preferred.

#### Salary

- \$45,000 \$55,000 annually, based on experience and qualifications.
- This is a part-time position with potential for expanded hours and responsibilities as funding allows.

## **Working Conditions**

- Part-time with flexible hours based on community needs and funding.
- Some work may involve on-call response, outdoor duties, or interaction with animals.
- Training, cultural orientation, and mentorship will be provided.
- Safety protocols will be in place for all aspects of the role.
